Despite the efforts of many EU governments, European youth today still face an increasing number of challenges that hinder their participation in society and can lead to social exclusion. At the societal level, chronically unbalanced circumstances that result in unequal access to socio-economic opportunities (lack of educational, cultural and employment opportunities) as well as discrimination (racial, religious, and gender-base, among others) can result in social exclusion. Whereas at the individual level, arginalization can also stem from the youth's desire to express opposition to mainstream values — disagreement with social values, lack of a sense of belonging to the overall community - that can be traced back to factors that are not necessarily linked to socio-economic disadvantage. Scarce participation in society, marginalization or self-marginalization, and isolation, are generally regarded as **potential risk factors for radicalization and extreme violence**. Combating radicalization thus implies adopting strategies and tools that have proven to be effective in daily practice.

The **SAFE ZONE** project intends to develop a **preventive action** aimed at young people in sports. In fact, sports play a relevant role in the life of many young people - both practically and symbolically - and sports coaches and educators are well placed to play a key role in preventing radicalization among youngsters. **SAFE ZONE** aims to contribute to the prevention of radicalization and violent extremism amongst youth in sports by increasing the awareness and capacity of sport coaches and educators to address radicalization and by adopting a **multi-agency approach** in order to consolidate preventive cooperation networks.

Within this framework, the "Youth, Marginalization and Sports" seminar will look at sports as a privileged observatory of daily practice to address marginalized youth and youth at risk of radicalization and violence. This seminar - the first of a series of three transnational exchange opportunities with experts from the participating EU countries (Germany, Italy, Portugal and Slovenia) - intends to stimulate a transnational discussion about the prevention of radicalization in sports and advance the development of related practices and procedures.

The seminar's aim is to provide a European opportunity for practice exchange and mutual learning while acknowledging the value of sports as an effective educational tool against youth radicalization. The seminar is also expected to contribute to the **creation of a network of European stakeholders** interested in, and working on, combating youth radicalization and extreme violence through sports.
