WHAT IS INTIT?

INTIT is a coordinated effort to support systemic change, mutual learning and the expanded use of integrated, evidence-based trauma informed care (TIC) for child victims of violence and abuse in current approaches to treatment and service provision, which are based on the Barnahus or other models.

WHY INTIT?

Children who have experienced violence, abuse or maltreatment are often subject to re-traumatization by service systems and professionals ill-equipped to meet the children's needs and provide services in a safe environment.

INTIT recognizes that even the most well-meaning professional, without adequate training, can re-traumatize the child and that services often operate in a manner that subjects the child to more harm.

Working with children in a beneficial manner means:

- PLACING CHILDREN AT THE CENTER OF A COORDINATED MULTI-AGENCY APPROACH
- CREATING A SAFE ENVIRONMENT
- ADOPTING A TIC APPROACH
